The Village of North Syracuse Regular Board Meeting began at 6:29 P.M. with Mayor Gary Butterfield asking everyone to join him in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll Call: Mayor Gary Butterfield, Trustee LouAnn St. Germain, Trustee Chris Strong, Trustee Fred Wilmer, and Dep. Mayor Gustafson.

Personnel Present: Village Clerk/Treasurer Dianne Kufel, CEO Brian Johnstone, DPW Superintendent Ed Ware, Fire Chief Patrick Brennan, Parks Director Teresa Roth, Village Attorney Robert Germain and Amy Franco Village Engineer.

Personnel Absent: Police Chief William Becker.

Public Hearing #1: Public Hearing is being held by the Board of Trustees to consider the placement of a crosswalk on South Bay Road in North Syracuse where it intersects with Maxwell Ave. and Grove Street and will hear all persons in support of such matter or any objections thereto.

The Mayor stated if you would like to speak in support or object just come up to the microphone and give us your name and address. **David Robinson, 163 Slindes Woods Cir.** stated he is fully in favor of a crosswalk going across South Bay Road as has been unable to walk, because he could not get across that road to go to restaurants, etc. He continued he is concerned about safety and spoke of signage and enforcement. He continued that passing on the right being an issue with no narrowing of the lane or curbing. He stated thirdly you have to do something about Grove St. and in the current code §230-62 it says that Grove Street is "No Thru Traffic"; if you go on the north end of Grove St. that curve, the way around that curve is typically on that sidewalk, particularly when someone is zooming thru Grove St. and coming into that curve. Mayor Butterfield asked if anyone else would like to speak for or against the crosswalks. Dep. Mayor Gustafson stated according to the Website question 80% of the people are in favor of that crosswalk. The Mayor asked if there was anyone and with no reply closed the public hearing.

APPROVAL OF BOARD MEETING MINUTES

Dep. Mayor Gustafson made a motion to approve the minutes from the July 23rd, 2020 Board Meeting. The motion was seconded by Trustee Wilmer. The motion was approved: St. Germain, Strong, Wilmer, and Gustafson, all voting in favor of the same.



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RESOLUTION # 146-20

GENERAL FUND ABSTRACT APPROVAL

Trustee Wilmer made a motion to approve Abstract #06 in the amount of \$120,214.45 covering voucher #227 to #291. The motion was seconded by Trustee Strong. The motion was approved: St. Germain, Strong, Wilmer, and Gustafson, all voting in favor of the same.

OLD BUSINESS:

RESOLUTION # 147-20 2019/2020 COMM. DEV. :GROVE ST. SIDEWALKS: BID RESULTS/AWARD BID

The Mayor stated first item on the agenda is the 2019 Comm. Dev.: Grove St. Sidewalks, we got the bid results and we would like to award the bid. The Board received the results, the lowest bid was E-Z Paving at \$97,000 with an alternate 1 at \$1,500 and Alternate 2 at \$1,000. Trustee Wilmer made motion to approve and award the bid to E-Z Paving in the amount of \$97,000 with an alternate 1 at \$1,500 and Alternate 2 at \$1,000 for the Grove St. Sidewalks. The motion was seconded by Trustee St. Germain. The Mayor opened it up for discussion. Trustee Wilmer asked if it will be curbed down the sides. Mrs. Franco stated yes there will be curbs. Trustee Wilmer clarified that it would be all the way to the park. Mrs. Franco continued yes, we are going to get that height difference, some of it is curbed now, but we wanted to add that vehicle and pedestrian separation. Trustee Wilmer clarified all the way to the park right. Mrs. Franco stated yes. Trustee Strong spoke of a call from a concerned citizen with a concern of texting and driving where there is no curbing currently, but we will be adding that for safety. Mrs. Franco checked and Comm. Dev. is allowing us to use the gazebo monies for this project. He added that is good news because the bids came in at \$97,000 we had \$50,000 and they allowed us to use the other \$50,000, so we are covered. Trustee Strong asked if we are adding 2 alternates, because it stated \$97,000 plus 2 alternates; he has not heard any discussion on those, are we leaning one way or the other. Mrs. Franco stated it is really up to the Board, it basically takes us past the park for a 100 sq. ft. not a huge amount, but it gives a little bit more based upon that dollar amount that they have provided to us, and that is why we did it that way, so Comm. Dev. is giving a \$100,000. Trustee Strong clarified that it is \$97,000 and we truly have \$100,000, so both of the alternates are covered. Mrs. Franco clarified one is for sidewalk and one is for curbing or for the asphalt restoration, obviously you kind of have to go hand in hand. Trustee Strong reiterated so for both we can get it in under the \$100,000. Mrs. Franco agreed and stated so it will get us to that next driveway. The motion was approved: St. Germain, Strong, Wilmer, and Gustafson, all voting in favor of the same.

RESOLUTION # 148-20

**AUTHORIZE THE MAYOR TO SIGN THE AGREEMENT WITH
E-Z PAVING FOR SIDEWALKS AND ALTERNATE(S)**



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Trustee Wilmer made a motion to allow the Mayor to sign the agreement utilizing the 2019 Comm. Dev. monies and the 2020 Comm. Dev. monies for E-Z Paving for sidewalks on Grove Street including the Alternates. The motion was seconded by Dep. Mayor Gustafson. The motion was approved: St. Germain, Strong, Wilmer, and Gustafson, all voting in favor of the same.

RESOLUTION # 149-20

**CROSSWALK-GROVE ST./SOUTHBAY/MAXWELL/
WATSON RD: ESTABLISH YAY OR NAY**

Trustee St. Germain made a motion to do the Crosswalk on South Bay Road as discussed at the Public Hearing. The motion was seconded by Trustee Wilmer. The Mayor agreed with Mr. Robinson, it is a difficult intersection, northbound traffic goes from 2 lanes to 1 right there, you have Maxwell and Watson coming together and then Van Mara and Grove, so we have to spot that were it is going to be the best possible and we should some abutments. The Board agreed with the Flashing Light Crosswalk Signage with the placement is yet to be decided. The motion was approved: St. Germain, Strong, Wilmer, and Gustafson, all voting in favor of the same.

CHESTNUT/CHURCH ST. REPAVING UPDATE

The Mayor stated the next item on the agenda is the progress for Church St. /Chestnut St., Chestnut St. is complete and we have got a lot of nice comments. He continued paving will take place in 3 to 4 weeks. He also asked them and he does not know if we got a price, when we installed those sidewalks before they were just fresh and some kids ran through them, so we patched them, but patch is always visible and there are 3 flags right next to where they are going to work that have settled where you would walk and it is a trip hazard, so he asked for a price from Costello to replace those 3 flags. DPW Sup't Ware stated he went down and showed him where you are referencing where the one drops down an inch, he stated it would be minor and did not give him a price. Trustee Strong asked if it is between Tolbert and Wadsworth down in that area. DPW Sup't Ware continued it is right before Wadsworth. The Mayor added now is the time to do it. Trustee Strong asked if all the poles were out yet. DPW Sup't Ware stated not quite, they are down to Lee Terr.; they have all the wires moved over, all the poles on the south side are removed and they should be plugging away within less than a week if it is Verizon. The Mayor stated he has been after them since last fall emailing back and forth, they come to the park and start their day there. DPW Sup't Ware stated they start at 9:00 AM and end their day before 3:00 PM. The Mayor continued he has sent some rather scathing emails to the Verizon Rep. He added Costello has more drainage work to do, so it is not holding them up, and the poles that are left are in line, if they are on the north side; they are in line with the other poles, so they are not a hindrance. He spoke of Costello been upset and he has been upset, everybody has been upset, what are you going to do to do it properly, he has been ready to call the public service commission, but they showed up.



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VACANCY: ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS

The Mayor stated next is a vacancy on the Zoning Board of Appeals, we have one interested person and he has to reach out to that person.

NEW BUSINESS:

RESOLUTION # 150-20

**SR. RECREATION LEADER: PERMANENT APPT. OF
DON RADELL AS OF 7/09/2020**

Dep. Mayor Gustafson made a motion to authorize the appointment of Don Radell for the Parks and Recreation as Sr. Rec. Leader as a Permanent Appt. effective 07/09/20 with an (8) wk. probation at a salary of \$32,646.25 effective 07/09/20. The motion was seconded by Trustee Wilmer. The motion was approved: St. Germain, Strong, Wilmer, and Gustafson, all voting in favor of the same.

DISCUSSION: 111 CHESTNUT STREET/REVAMP; FIRE STATIONS 2'S FUTURE

The Mayor stated the next on the agenda is a conversation about both 111 Chestnut Street and Fire Station 2, this is for dialogue only. He continued he had a conversation with the Fire Chief, this chief and prior chiefs, knowing that they are struggling with memberships with getting out of Station 2, etc. He added also 111 Chestnut Street is the house right next door to the Fire Dept., it also a back up to DPW and it is falling down around its ears, it is uninhabitable; he would like for the Village to get our hands on that if we can. Dep. Mayor Gustafson asked if it was for sale or tax delinquent. The Mayor stated no, we are working on that, so if we can make it happen, it is preliminary just to get it out there. He continued a future Station 2; we have talked about it for a while and if we are able to get 111 Chestnut Street, then we could add a bay on to the Fire Dept., because they are really short a bay. He went on to say then we could decertify Station 2 and with the sale of Station 2 we could afford to do the work over at the Fire Dept. He opened it up for anyone who would like to speak. Dep. Mayor Gustafson stated she has toured Station 2 under the last chief and at the time there were no trucks up there, it was storage only and there were 2 Bunk-ins. She continued she was told at the time, that they were not using that, because they did not have the manpower to man it; they were not taking calls, so it was just to be used for storage, is this still the case. Much conversation went back and forth regarding the need for Station 2 and expanding Station 1 to fulfill the needs of the Fire Department. The Mayor reiterated that we are just in the talking stage, because not knowing the future of volunteerism. He continued we had talked about combining trucks when the next one comes up, if we can get that property, we will only have one chance to get it, but it is really not repairable. He spoke of CEO Johnstone and Fire Chief Brennan has been in there. He stated it is in shambles and there are turkey vultures living in the garage, so if you see birds with big, big wing span flying around.



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The Mayor continued they kind of have to go hand and hand, we would have to find out what 111 Chestnut St. and Station 2 are worth; it is a process. More to follow on this.

DISCUSSION: OCCRA- NEXT YEAR 2021
CHANGES IN RECYCABLES

The Mayor stated the next item is OCCRA Changes, we talked about it at one of our meetings, but more emails are coming through. He continued the OCCRA Budget is coming out in September and there is no doubt that there is going to be an increase, not just to the Village, but to all municipalities for recycling. He added so that is another one of the struggles we are having that he will deal with in his report, that is just to let you know something is coming down the pike.

RESOLUTION # 151-20

REVIEW AND ADOPT THE UPDATED SEXUAL HARASSMENT AND
DISCRIMINATION POLICY

The Mayor stated the next item on the agenda is to review and adopt the Discrimination and Harassment Policy; the Board has received a copy, it allows someone to file a claim with in 3 years, previously it was 2 years. Trustee Wilmer made a motion to adopt the updated Discrimination and Harassment Policy. The motion was seconded by Dep. Mayor Gustafson. Trustee Strong clarified that this is going to be for all employees with in the Village, so this has gone out Dept. Heads and we have got the feedback that they have had a chance to review this and discuss it with all employees including the Fire Dept. Village Clerk-Treasurer Kufel stated yes. Trustee Strong stated because they are considered Village Employees and there has not been an Association Meeting to get through, so for Workers' Comp they are considered employees. The Mayor stated we had a discussion that the Policy that the Fire Dept. has qualifies. Fire Chief Brennan stated you bring up a good point; the Fire Dept. was involved in conversations and asked if that was the only change that they are making is that you are going to the 3 year mark or are you making other changes to the policy. Village Clerk-Treasurer Kufel continued it is more involved with "discrimination"; just because of the nature of what is happening here today. Atty. Germain stated he reviewed it and it has got the new information in it, and he thinks the Board would have to adopt it first, before it goes to the employees. The Mayor stated so the question came up about the Fire Dept., would they have to go through it, because they have their own, so would they have to go through it again for the one that we adopt. Atty. Germain continued that is not up to him, but he would suggest that they do it; it is a level of protection for us. Much conversation about the ESIP on-line training verses the NYMIR classroom training and if they both were comparable and acceptable trainings for the Village compliance policy. Further clarification will follow from NYMIR. The motion was approved: St. Germain, Strong, Wilmer, and Gustafson, all voting in favor of the same.



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FIRE PITS IN THE VILLAGE: REVIEW CODE

The Mayor stated item on the agenda is Fire Pits in the Village, the reason it is on the agenda is because he has a resident that is now emailing him pictures. He continued he has already communicated quite a bit with CEO Johnstone, our Codes Dept. as well as the Police Dept. and so they sent the Fire Dept. He added and it is 1 fire pit that is used a lot and neighbor 2 doors down does not like the use of the fire pit. He stated after the 2nd email he responded, he will look into it and that is the reason it is on the agenda. The Mayor asked CEO Johnstone what our code regulation is regarding fire pits. CEO Johnstone stated we do not have one. Trustee St. Germain asked if we were talking about the fire pits that you buy at Loew's, Home Depot or making their own fire pits. The Mayor added yes or you can make. Trustee St. Germain continued what is the reason the person is saying that they do not like it. The Mayor stated the smoke bothers him. Dep. Mayor Gustafson stated it is the same as barbequing. Trustee St. Germain added that some of them do not smell wonderful, because they burn trash in them. The Mayor continued they are not supposed to burn trash. He asked CEO Johnstone to update them now since the Village does not have a policy. CEO Johnstone continued we do not have a code for fire pits or fire places; we use regulations from the NYS DEC and the 2020 Fire Code of the State of New York to regulate the location, how big it can be. The Mayor stated it is good coverage. CEO Johnstone clarified the NYS DEC coverages what you can and cannot burn, and the state code covers where it can and cannot be. The Mayor continued that is the reason we do not have anything in our Village Code, because it covers both of those codes. He added the fire pit in question is in a backyard that is deep, so it is nowhere near these houses; the complainant, nevertheless they are relentless. He stated they stated they had to put in AC, but even with the AC they can still smell it and they sent him 2 pictures and neither one was in violation. He continued one was a clean burn, and the other showed smoke going straight up in a narrow column; neither of those is a violation of anything. The Mayor added he is bringing it up just for your information. The Mayor asked Atty. Germain if he had any words of advice for the Board. Atty. Germain stated if you want anything to go by, then you need to adopt an underlying ordinance, there are some out there, but you have to draw the line and see if you want it in the Village or not. The Mayor stated he believed the Town of Salina has outlawed them, but he did not know if that was necessarily the right decision either. Village Clerk-Treasurer Kufel stated there are a lot of complaints in the Town of Salina, they have had Board Meetings. Atty. Germain continued no matter what you do, you have to enforce. The Mayor asked CEO Johnstone if he has responded more than once and gone over. CEO Johnstone stated yes, so had the Fire Dept. and the Police Dept. The Mayor added when they get there the fire is out. CEO Johnstone continued it is normally the next morning. The Mayor asked if it was smoldering. CEO Johnstone added there was never any smoke. Trustee Wilmer asked if Fire Chief Brennan had been there. Fire Chief Brennan stated he does not remember the exact address; they do go on a lot of open burn complaints, but most people are very responsible and their recreational pits. He continued he did not think it would be in the best interest of the Village or the residents of the Village to change or adopt something more restrictive.



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He added especially in the Covid age that we are living in right now when we are asking people to stay home. He stated they do go on some of them and they are neighbor disputes. He continued we had adopted in the Fire Dept., Trustee Strong and the City of Syracuse there is a flow chart with the Fire Code and also the DEC Code and how you can go down the line. He explained the bottom line is if they have a garden hose there, if supervised and when they are done they put the fire out and as long as it is out and not around any combustibles and it is in the back of the property; we are O.K. with that. He added just tell the public, some people have s'mores and some people cookout. He stated when they do find and put a stop to be the illegal burns when people are burning brush, trash, construction debris; that is all illegal stuff and we not only see it in the Village, but all over our fire district. He continued it has not gotten out of hand, but through the Fire Dept., not the residents.

CITIZENS' VOICE: The Mayor invited anyone that wished to share concerns or thoughts via Facebook to address the Board. The Mayor asked if anyone would like to speak and closed Citizen's Voice.

ATTORNEY REPORT: No Report.

ENGINEER REPORT: No Report.

DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORTS:

Police Department: (Police Chief: William Becker): Absent.

- July 24th, 2020 NSPD underwent Full Accreditation assessment process to include full review of all accreditation files, interviews of personnel, inspection of Police Dept. /Equipment to confirm compliance with the state accreditation standards. There were no discrepancies or write-ups noted during the review. Mayor Butterfield was provided with a telephone conference out brief of results of the inspection. A small contingent of NSPD personnel including him will be making a trip to Albany on September 3rd to receive our award at the quarterly held accreditation luncheon.
- North Syracuse Police Child ID card system has been purchased and fielded. This \$11,000 system was purchased from donations and community policing grant awards.
- The Police Dept. lobby has been completed and is now re-opened - Electronic door security due to protesters/illness monitoring due to Covid-19, have been installed to provide controlled access into the department.
- Community Disc Golf Event-Event to bring Community and police together. NSPD will be hosting this event on August 15th, from 10 AM to noon, at Heritage Park-322 Chestnut St.
- NSPD has ordered Autism Awareness Police Patches for members to wear during the Month



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of April. We have purchased these items to promote Autism awareness to community members since there are many children who reside in our Village with Autism.

- Stats for month of July 2020: 1102 Total Calls for service, 535 Property Checks, 19 Domestic, 17 Motor Vehicle Accidents, 174 Traffic Stops, 123 Traffic tickets, 29 Arrests
- Stats so far in August: 424 Total Calls for service, 192 Property Checks, 7 Domestic, 3 Motor Vehicle Accidents, 96 Traffic Stops, 73 Traffic tickets, 7 Arrests

Fire Department: (Fire Chief Patrick Brennan) He stated the following:

- We have been busy at the Fire House
- We are reorganizing space within the station with construction being done internally in house
- Our membership is picking up and we have college students joining us
- Engine 6 is progressing well; expect delivery end of September
- The Rescue went out of service and got some paint work done up in Rochester, did not come back like they like and they have agreed to redo it in the spring
- Rescue 7 commitment made to PESH about ladder has been backordered due to COVID, but expect it to get it in within the next 2 weeks at a greatly reduced cost

Public Works Department: (DPW Sup't.: Ed Ware) He stated the following:

- Bulk: wastes so far this year have picked up 107 tons of trash, 215 mattresses
- Brush: we have picked up 432 tons of brush that is 864,480 lbs.
- Stops to check on Costello to see if they need anything
- Doing storm drains and road maintenance

The Mayor asked the Fire Chief if the communication with Costello is any better now. Fire Chief Brennan stated the communication is better through the DPW Sup't. DPW Sup't. Ware stated he is down there each day asking if they have called the Fire Dept. and then he calls Chief Brennan to verify they have called him. Chief Brennan stated it has gotten better.

Parks and Recreation Department: (Parks Director: Teresa Roth) She stated the following:

- Tomorrow is the last day of our Summer Camp Program; gone successfully, no COVID related issues, approximately 78 kids they could have in program this year
- Pool operations going well this year, closing August 25th; capacity at 50 still worth doing that
- Unable to have concerts due to COVID limitations
- 3 interviews set up next Tuesday and Wednesday for her replacement
- Ordered new conference microphone system for this room for your meetings and a new mixer, should be here in week to 10 days
- She shared it may be her last meeting



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The Mayor stated that there are 3 interviews, but there were 8 applicants and a 9th that was not part of the system, not from the county. He continued we can go farther down. More to follow.

Codes Department: (CEO: Brian Johnstone) He stated the following:

- Thurs., Aug. 20th pending a flow test reading on hydrants from OCWA, Brolex Properties will be before the Plan. Comm. again for 444 S. Main St. Apartment Project
- We rec'd a flow test back today and OCWA 444 N. Main St., so we have to see if they can get it done in 4 days, because of Fire Dept. concerns on gallons per minute for these 3 apartment complex buildings; right now it looks like the 1 hydrant is not going to be enough if there were to be a fire there
- He referenced the meeting on how the Village was doing and he ran some of the codes for our permits and we are only 7 less than last year which is pretty good. April was a bad month for us, but it looks like when the Stimulus Checks came out we were up, so we are back on track

Trustee Strong expressed a concern that they are not open to the public to attend. Atty. Germain explained they are not like a Board Meeting; we have to be closed if there were more to attend that allowed, re-noticed and all redone.

Clerk-Treasurer: She stated the following:

- Working on the Mural in the Village, had one gal gave a quote way out of reach
- 97% of closing the books, next week final financial for May
- Laserfiche, had presentation, still looking at/working with Michael on that, looks promising and doable and she and Deputy Village Clerk-Treasurer Ilacqua can do that
- Have been working on the Civil Service hiring process for Sr. Rec. Leader Radell and Parks Director Roth's replacement and the canvassing letters

DEPUTY MAYOR-TRUSTEES REPORT:

Trustee St. Germain: She thanked Parks Director Roth for her years of service and stated she will be missed. She also thanked her for being part of the process to find her replacement; hopefully it will mirror what we have got. She also encourage to support local businesses, she has been ordering and going to pick up, but has not yet been in to sit down at any restaurant yet; but she thinks that is just as good for them.

Trustee Strong: He stated the flowers are looking great and people are commenting on them, so DPW staff, thank you for water and taking care of them on off hours. He continued to echo the comments for Parks Director Roth and working with her over a couple of decades either as a Fire Chief or as a Trustee and Member of the Village. He spoke of everything being positive, well maintained, wonderful job; he thanked her and wished her the best of luck in Cicero. He continued a couple of people have



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asked and we have not heard anything on the Police contract, we are supposed to be getting together to review and it has been pretty silent for 3 weeks.

Trustee Wilmer: He thanked Parks Director Roth for her service for the past years. He stated he would like to have an Executive Session afterwards for discussion of a personnel matter.

Dep. Mayor Gustafson: She stated she has had several opportunities to drive down Church St. and it is so nice and she continued congratulations on getting that done. She shared with Parks Director Roth how she is going to be missed.

MAYOR'S REPORT:

The Mayor stated that Parks Director Roth will be missed; it is 15 yrs., she came his 1st year as Trustee and he helped with the interview process. He shared there are a couple more projects potentially in the Village, he spoke of some more additional tax revenue, because right now it is a vacant lot; St. Rose is in the process and have a sale pending of the convent. He continued there are 2 interested parties, and want to turn it into commercial or residential space, so that would go back on the tax rolls. He went on to say on South Bay Rd. where the trees were cut down, there is someone that is going to put up a project there, but not right away, so that would go back on the tax rolls. He stated last Friday he got a call from Village Clerk-Treasurer Kufel stated that she was starting to wrap up last year's financials for the 1st time in 15 yrs.; we spent more than we took in. He continued she sent to him a very simplified breakdown, based on that information and other information that he had heard like a significant drop in sales tax revenue in the county, he had a Dept. Head Meeting this past Wednesday just to bring the Dept. Heads up to speed on where we are and what could happen going forward. He added initially he was confident that we were protected for this Budget year but unsure what is going to happen going forward. He just wanted to bring the Dept. Heads up to speed and see, it is not finalized yet, but it looks like we are going to have to take \$25,000 from the Fund Balance. He spoke of always asking Village Clerk-Treasurer Kufel what she thought and she was forecasting \$50,000 - \$75,000 left and all of the sudden it turned out not to be so, that was the reason for the meeting. He spoke of riding his bike on Church St. once and he is hopefully we can get the Grove St. project done this year, be mindful we do not know what is going to happen down the road.

The Mayor stated he would like to entertain a motion to go into executive session to discuss personnel issue.

Dep. Mayor Gustafson made a motion to enter into **Executive Session** at 7:26 P.M. The motion was seconded by Trustee Wilmer. The motion was approved: St. Germain, Strong, Wilmer, and Gustafson,



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all voting favor of the same.

Mayor Butterfield made a motion to return to **Regular Session** at 7:49 P.M. The motion was seconded by Dep. Mayor Gustafson. The motion was approved: St. Germain, Strong, Wilmer, and Gustafson, all voting favor of the same.

Trustee Wilmer made a motion to adjourn at 7:50 PM. The motion was seconded by Trustee Strong. The motion was approved: St. Germain, Strong, Wilmer, and Gustafson, all voting in favor of the same.
